**Special Permit #12-01**

**96 Route 6A**

**Dockmejian Realty Trust (Blake)**

Mr. Neeven read the Public Hearing Notice into the record. He also read the following comment letters into the record:

Attorney Kevin Kirrane addressed the Board and introduced Dr. Bake to the members. She proposes to open a veterinary clinic with dog grooming facilities and a small retail area in a 3100 sq. ft. space. The appointments would be scheduled with walk-ins being held to a minimum. She plans to household pets only with no outdoor activities except walking them as needed. The hours of operation will be 8am – 6pm with two hours for lunch. When asked about animals staying overnight, Dr. Blake said it would be unusual as pets requiring overnight stays are sent to veterinarians who have overnight staffing. The Board also determined that there is sufficient parking.

Mr. Neeven opened the meeting for public comment. Barbara Shaner, 91 Route 6A commented on the plans showing three dog runs and wondered if that meant only three dogs at a time; she also wondered about the cats. Dr. Blake said that there would only be three dogs at a time in the runs and that there were cages for the cats. Ms. Shaner expressed her concern regarding egress onto Route 6A because the visibility is poor heading east.



Mr. Jensen motioned for the Board to close the public hearing for a Special Permit #12-01, 96 Route 6A. Mr. Mitchell seconded. The vote was unanimous
